From the Principal ...

Reading is one of our school learning priorities:

Every Child is Expected to Read Aloud to an Adult Everyday (This is a 'not negotiable' and needs to be completed by all students).

School Assembles

Last week we held a series of short assemblies. During these assemblies the staff and I took the opportunity to talk with the students about issues that are important to us as a school. These issues included:

- > The expectations around Reading every child is expected to read aloud to an adult every day
- > Uniform it was very pleasing to note throughout the assemblies that students were in school uniform, as a large group they looked fabulous.
- > A reminder to all students that our school is a SAFE LANGUAGE ZONE, which means no offensive language will be accepted at school from anyone.
- > Behaviour of students at school students were reminded that 'this school does not tolerate harassment of any kind.'

Safety at School

The staff and I are determined to ensure that every child is safe at school. There are 2 major concerns at the moment.

- 1. We have had a few students leave the school grounds, chasing a ball, or just 'testing the boundaries' of our Behaviour Management Polices. NO student is allowed to leave the school grounds in school time unless they are signed out at the front office and accompanied by an adult.
- 2. While the behaviour of students has been outstanding and the school is very settled, we occasionally have the challenge of students' teasing, bullying or inappropriate behaviour. Staff and I take the view that every incident of inappropriate behaviour needs to be dealt with appropriately and as soon as possible.

As a parent or caregiver, if you become aware of any incident in the school of teasing or bullying, could you please make your child's teacher aware of this as soon as possible?

We will be reminding students about these issues from time to time, however, could you please talk to your children to help us ensure their wellbeing at school? Thank you.


Online safety and Online Bullying
